### CV SUMMARY

#### Scientific & social contributions

Three six-year recognized research periods 2001/06, 2007/12 and 2013/18, covering my entire academic career. The fourth will not be evaluated until December 2024, but enough research merits have already been achieved for it.

My research work began as a research fellow in 2001. Since that moment all my work has focused on contributing to the field of the analysis of the diffusion of Information and Communication Technologies (ICT), their socioeconomic effects along with the emerging digital divides. My PhD thesis "Metrics and indicators of the information society: An approach to the diffusion of ICT and the digital divide" (qualification: outstanding cum laude) which was Extraordinary Doctoral Award of the University of Oviedo and prize of the European Foundation of the Information Society, was among the first one to be defended on this topic in Spain (year 2007).

The results of my research activity have followed an increasing evolution with a total of 46 articles in scientific publications, author/co-author of 18 books/book chapters, and 21 research projects/contracts. Among them, it is worth mentioning that the results of the project carried

out in collaboration with Cisco Systems International and the University of Oxford were cited by prestigious media such as the Financial Times, The New York Times, The Economist, The International Herald Tribune, and the BBC, among others. The Economist Intelligence Unit also echoed the results of the project in its 2010 report ("[Digital economy rankings 2010.Beyond e-readiness](#)"). I also led a project on the study of life satisfaction among Spaniards during the COVID-19 pandemic (2020) funded by La Caixa Foundation in a competitive call in which the success rate was 2.5%.

Currently I am the Principal Investigator of the project E-WELLBEING granted with 103,000 euros for two years.

Since 2021 I work for the Joint Research Centre of the European Commission ISPRA as an expert.

Likewise, I have carried out research stays in centers of international prestige such as the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) (2008), the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) (2009, 2010 and 2011) and Curtin University (Australia) (2016).
