## About OIKONET

OIKONET is a network of 34 schools of architecture and planning, research groups, professional and community organizations, and local administrations from 25 countries in Europe and around the world. The goal of the network is to promote innovation in the study of dwelling at a global scale by interlinking three areas: pedagogy, research and community participation. Through the activities developed in the last three years with the support of the Lifelong Learning Programme of the European Union, OIKONET has created a platform of collaboration to promote the study of contemporary housing from a multidisciplinary and global perspective by encompassing the multiple dimensions which condition the forms of dwelling in today's societies (architectural, urban, environmental, economic, cultural and social).

During the last three years of activities, participatory actions and pedagogical and research activities have brought together various stakeholders and disciplines. Some of the most relevant events organized by the network are:

- three international conferences on the theme “Global Dwelling” carried out in Barcelona (2014), Bratislava (2015) and Manchester (2016)
- three international workshops with the participation of students and tutors from the participating schools, dedicated to analyze issues related with contemporary dwelling at its various scales in case studies located in Lisbon (2014), Berlin/Cottbus (2015) and Belgrade (2016).
- 15 working meetings dedicated to debate issues related with contemporary dwelling with regard to research on housing studies, community participation and pedagogic innovation.

The intensive work developed in the last three years has given rise to numerous reports, publications, blogs and videos which are available in the project website. A book summarizing the network activity in the last three years is being completed and will be released on May 2017.

### POSTGRADUATE SEMINAR

After having accumulated this experience, OIKONET starts a series of POSTGRADUATE Seminars aimed at bring together researchers interested to explore the topic of dwelling in our contemporary societies from a multidisciplinary and multidimensional perspective. The seminars’s aims are:

- to facilitate the exchange among young researchers, especially among Phd students working in areas related to dwelling in contemporary societies.
- to foster the creation of alliances among researchers and their institutions to continue developing pedagogic and research programs in areas related to contemporary global dwelling.
- to keep developing and framework that brings together pedagogic innovation, housing research and community outreach in order to get a better understanding of today’s forms of dwelling and building.

## INTERGATING RESEARCH AND PEDAGOGY IN THE FIELD OF HOUSING STUDIES.

The interactions between research activity and pedagogical work can benefit players in both fields and give rise to innovative, cross-disciplinary learning spaces. Some possible effects of these interactions are:

- Establishing pedagogic paradigms such as “research as design”, “design-based research” and “designerly research”, in the academic programs dealing with housing
- Enabling architecture and urban planning students to acquire and develop their research skills during their studies
- Identifying the needs of dwellers in our multicultural, mobile and transient societies, in order to provide the appropriate housing provision
- Creating inclusive learning spaces where experts from various disciplines (from architecture to sociology, to environmental psychology, to ) participate in defining the issues to be addressed in projects dealing with contemporary housing and dwelling, from the design of residential buildings to territorial and urban planning.
- Identifying the skills and competences that today’s graduates need to have to effectively address the task of giving form to the living environment during their professional practice.

### 3. Publicaciones en co-autoría

#### 3.1 PROYECTOS I+D+I internacionales competitivos

Desde el curso 2003/04, la Escuela de Arquitectura La Salle de Barcelona ha estado coordinando y dirigiendo una serie de proyectos financiados por la Unión Europea encaminados a innovar los procesos de aprendizaje sobre la vivienda. Esta línea de trabajo comenzó con HOUSING@21.EU ([www.housing21eu.net](http://www.housing21eu.net)), un programa intensivo Erasmus; seguido por el campus virtual OIKODOMOS ([www.oikodomos.org](http://www.oikodomos.org)) llevado a cabo en el marco del Lifelong Learning Program en dos etapas, de 2007 a 2009 y de 2009 a 2011 en el que ya participó la UNIVERSITAT POLITÈCNICA DE VALÈNCIA. El objetivo de OIKODOMOS fue integrar distintas materias o asignaturas (proyectos, urbanismo, energía (instalaciones), sostenibilidad), distintos niveles académicos (grado y master), diversos tipos de curso (asignaturas optativas, anuales, cuatrimestrales, seminarios) y alumnos (estudiantes, ciudadanos) para hacer un campus virtual dedicado al estudio de la vivienda contemporánea. Una plataforma de aprendizaje se creó para apoyar la metodología blended-learning del campus virtual OIKODOMOS

El último proyecto en esta línea de trabajo dedicada al aprendizaje y la enseñanza de la vivienda contemporánea ha sido el proyecto "OIKONET: A global multidisciplinary network on housing research and learning" co-financiado por el Lifelong Learning Programme de la Unión Europea, en el período 2013/16 en la que la **UNIVERSITAT POLITÈCNICA DE VALÈNCIA** ha participado junto con treinta y cuatro instituciones representando veintinueve países dentro y fuera de Europa forman parte de esta red. Los socios son instituciones universitarias -de arquitectura, urbanismo, ingeniería, economía y sociología- grupos de investigación, administraciones locales y organizaciones profesionales. El objetivo de OIKONET ha sido transformar el anterior campus virtual OIKODOMOS en una red dedicada a estudiar la vivienda contemporánea desde una perspectiva multidisciplinar y global. Una característica específica de OIKONET, que le distingue de los dos programas anteriores, es que abarca tres ámbitos que se interrelacionan a partir de las actividades que se llevan a cabo en el proyecto: pedagogía, investigación y participación ciudadana.

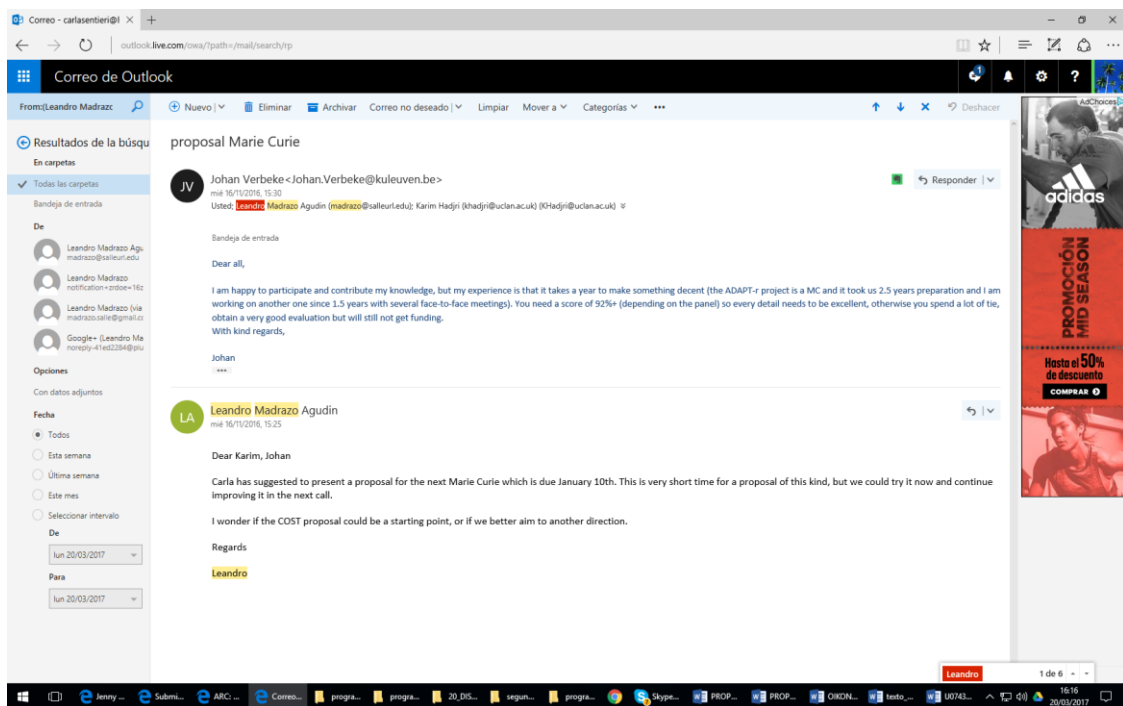
## 4. Cooperaciones futuras
